I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust."

What do you think of when you think about trust? Do you think of someone always having your back? Do you think about someone who does what they say? What does trust mean to you?

When it comes to relationships, most of the time trust comes with time. As time passes, you see the person in a variety of different situations and you begin to see who they really are. You begin to see how they think and respond to situations. And over time, you begin to trust that person. You begin to know if what they say is true and if they'll follow through.

Today's Bible verse is all about trust. Can you say that God is who you trust? Read Matthew 14:22-33
