

Luke 4:1-13



8 Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.'"



- "The greatest trick he ever played was to make the world believe he didn't exist."


Scripturally speaking... Was Jesus, the God-man, capable of giving in to temptation? Thinking in timelines, what is the first recorded temptation? Why is Jesus referred to as "the second Adam"?



Outside of Luke 4:1-13...

- a) Temptation came to Jesus after an act of amazing obedience.
- b) Was He only tempted on this one occasion?
- c) Having resisted effectively, He was further filled with the power of the Holy Spirit.
- d) He was utterly rejected by those who ought to have loved him most.

e) His teaching had new authority and was supported by signs and wonders, amazing healings and the removals of impure spirits.
f) These demonic spirits were cowed by Him – they recognised Him as the Holy One of God. Was it partly because they knew He could defeat temptation?
g) He was burning with zeal to teach the whole of Israel – He would not stay long in any one place.
















"Since You are the Son of God, command these stones to become bread."

Stones resembled loaves - No harm, it's ok.

Jesus was supposed to be fasting, not taking short cuts through His Divine power.

The tempter distorts Scripture to make the temptation respectable.

(The sin of Israel in the desert was refusal to believe that God could provide food)

It is written (in the Shema, God's word to the Israelites,

DEUT 6, 13)

"Worship the LORD your God, and serve only Him"

So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin.




1 John 1:9
