SKCC established the Integrate Refugee Project in November 2015 as a response to our perception of the ever-increasing need for a community response to the plight of young unaccompanied minors fleeing from war and oppression in their own countries.

English is taught on Thursday afternoons with as many as 25 students followed by a youth club event where numbers increase to 30-40. (June 2016)

Please continue to pray for all those involved with this project and for the many youth who are being reached each week.

In addition, the Salvation Army in Hythe and SKCC work together from time to time to provide 'fun activities' for refugee minors. This week Barney & Gary were involved with a bowling trip (funded by the churches in Hythe).
