

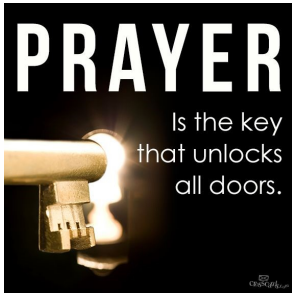
Contact Book 2018

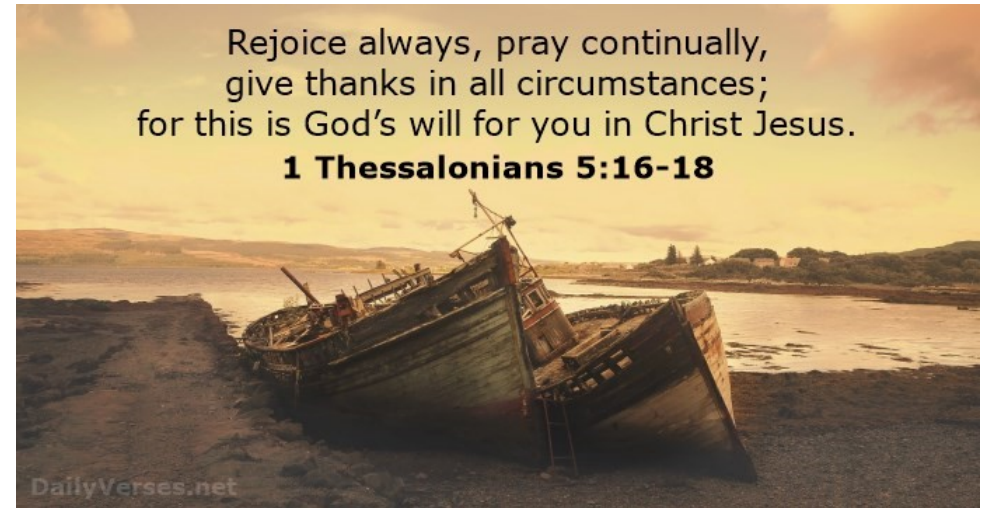

What do you do when life falls apart and it feels as though God has left you?
How do you keep going when your faith has been rocked to the core?
We all go through painful times but sometimes things get so hard we're not sure where God is or what He's up to.
