THE CORNERSTONE CENTRE - BUILDING UPDATE

Back Hall refurbishment - you may remember we received a large grant in 2018 towards the complete refurbishment of the back hall which has a number of significant issues both internally and externally? It may not show yet, but lots of work has been going on behind I the scenes to get designs and plans in place to begin works. As you expect with such a project the quoted costs to do the work have increased significantly beyond our first estimations. The building sub-committee have worked hard to find ways to reduce costs without undermining the original plans and we will need to find ways to cover the increase. I We are trusting God to provide.

In terms of timescales and practicalities, we expect to receive planning permission within the next week which will enable us to book the contractors and begin work (dates to be confirmed).

During the renovation process the back hall will be shut so this will affect a number of existing activities. We are working through the logistics of managing the changes with the least amount of disruption as possible, but it's likely things will get a bit messy whilst the works are happening, so please do bear with us.

Your prayer support would be much appreciated; for monies to come in, for works to run smoothly and quickly and for all the activities currently running from the back hall to continue well with the least amount of upheaval.
