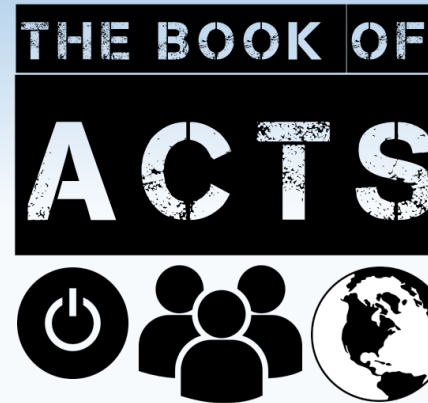

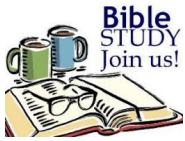

Youth Club for school years 6-13 re-starts this Friday at 6.30 p.m. in the back hall at The Cornerstone Centre. For further information see Barney.

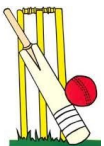
