

South Korea - Abi Barnes

Abi is settling into life in South Korea. She lives with her team mate Bella on an island called Gadeok which is part of the city of Busan and is currently doing outreach with YWAM. If you would like to send Abi some encouragement please see Julie Oliver who has her contact details.

Nepal - The Gurung family

The Gurungs' vision is to see healthy reproducing churches amongst the 25 unreached mountain peoples of Nepal who are classified as unreached people groups because there are only a handful of believers (or none) within each group. Most are between one and three weeks walk from the end of the road and live above 2500m in elevation (Ben Nevis is 1345m). As they can't reach all of them they focus on two main mountain areas and touch four people groups.

The Gurungs also have a Children's Home (ages 6-16yrs) and College Next Step program (ages 16yrs to 18+yrs) and a church focusing on the mountain people living in or visiting Kathmandu.

In 2017 the Gurungs joined the Pioneers organisation and are now better supported as a family, and have a newly formed Pioneers team which is made up of 3 other families and 1 single man from 4 different nations, working together to reach the mountain peoples.
