Starting today our theme for Sunday mornings over the summer will be the book of James. There will also be weekly activities for children.




**SPONGES** (18-25's group) meets at Willetts House on 5th August, at 6 p.m. for Pizza and Volleyball.

#### Volunteers needed for the Wellbeing Hub Project

led by Folkestone Baptist Church

The Wellbeing Hub is based at the Mind Centre in Tontine Street and is currently open on Thursday and Sunday evenings with the aim of being a welcoming, supportive place to meet for people with mental health issues. As well as offering a warm smile and a listening ear, The Wellbeing Hub also provides a meal and a range of activities to enjoy.

In order to roll out the project as intended more volunteers will be needed. Free training on a Mental Health First Aid Course is provided for all volunteers. It does not have to be a weekly commitment, it is fine just to do one or two sessions a month.
