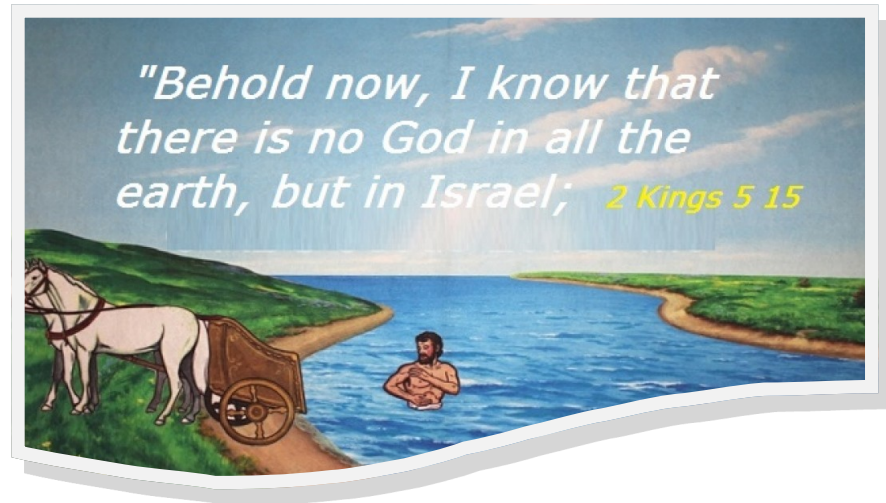

#### HYTHE Churches March of Witness
