

## Dorcas rise Acts 9:36-42

10th November 2019

#### Joppa

- Jonah sailed from Joppa to escape from God's presence (Jonah 1:3).
- Cedar wood was shipped to the port of Joppa and then taken to Jerusalem when "Solomon determined to build a house for the name of the Lord..." (2 Chronicles 2:1; 16)
- It was a major port and trading centre, and was strategically located on the Via Maris, a major ancient trading route.
- The ancient biblical city of Joppa was located on Israel's western border on the Mediterranean coastline, about 35 miles to the west of Jerusalem. Today, it is incorporated into the greater city of Tel Aviv.





#### Lydda

- Also known as Lod.
- A small Palestinian city, which lies east of Tel Aviv and west of Ramallah and Jerusalem.
- The epicentre of the Arab-Israeli conflict
- Where St George is buried. Thought also to have come from and killed there.







Acts 9:36-42 New International Version (NIV)

<sup>36</sup> In Joppa there was a disciple named Tabitha (in Greek her name is Dorcas); she was always doing good and helping the poor. <sup>37</sup> About that time she became sick and died, and her body was washed and placed in an upstairs room.

<sup>38</sup> Lydda was near Joppa; so when the disciples heard that Peter was in Lydda, they sent two men to him and urged him, "Please come at once!"

<sup>39</sup> Peter went with them, and when he arrived he was taken upstairs to the room. All the widows stood around him, crying and showing him the robes and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was still with them.

<sup>40</sup> Peter sent them all out of the room; then he got down on his knees and prayed. Turning toward the dead woman, he said, "Tabitha, get up." She opened her eyes, and seeing Peter she sat up. <sup>41</sup> He took her by the hand and helped her to her feet. Then he called for the believers, especially the widows, and presented her to them alive. <sup>42</sup> This became known all over Joppa, and many people believed in the Lord.






Elijah - Widow of Zarephath's Son (1 Kings 17:17–24)

#### Miracle man responds to wife's heartfelt plea to live

By all accounts Dr Sean George is a medical miracle, returning from the dead to amaze colleagues who buttled for almost an hour to review his lifefess heart.

The 39-year-old specialist from Kalgoorlie Hospital says he owes his life to pleas from his wife to stay alive for the sake of their young son and the medical staff who refused to give up even when they believed his beart attack had killed him.


His remarkable story began four months ago as he drove home to Kalgoorlie with his female internafter a clinic sension in Esperance. He felt minor chest pains which he thought was bad indigestion but eventually pulled into a GP clinic in Kambakis where he used an ECG to diagnose a heart attack.

Soon after, he went into cardiac arrest and blacked out, leaving his intern and clinic staff to a graelling marathon of resuscitation, using 4000 chest compressions and 13 electrical shots to try to jump start his beart.

By the time his wife Sherry Jacob, also a doctor, and emergency physicians from Kalgocelie arrived, staff had worked on him for almost 55 minutes with no sign of life.
