Heathers Newsletter September 2020

Hello from rapidly warming up Mozambique! I know it's been a long time since I wrote a newsletter but I'm glad I've been able to be in contact with some of you through social media. The Covid-19 cases here have not been recorded as bad compared to other places (currently getting to 8000) and we at Kedesh have all remained well and healthy. Praise God!

The lock down at Kedesh started at the end of March when the Government closed the schools and put restrictions in place. Schools have still not opened up so since then we have remained locked down and have tried to keep the boys occupied with various activities. In the mornings they have to participate in projects or some kind of school studies. Projects have included learning how to brick lay and then putting it into practice helping to build our perimeter wall, building a table football table, working in the vegetable garden and recently starting to make a mini golf course.

During the first month of lock down the boys schools provided them with work to do at home that I helped them complete. After that, I just had to make things up and I mostly worked with the younger boys, focusing on maths and reading and writing Portuguese. More recently I have begun teaching English as the boys expressed an interest (and I am from England after all!). I have four groups of varying ages and abilities and although a lot of work, the boys are keen and seem to be enjoying learning.



As well as schoolwork the boys also have free time in the afternoons to run around and play (or sleep, popular if you are a teenager). Popular past times include frisbee, golf and swimming and fishing in the pond. All the boys have now learnt to ride a bike too with the help of the others and cycle around our properties on the three bikes we brought. The boys have also enjoyed playing with the risk table and table football table that they built.



We received two new additions to our home a couple of months ago. This is Baptista, he is about 15 and is very hard of hearing. He was not getting on well at another centre so was transferred to us. Despite his disability he has settled in well and we are all learning how best to communicate with him (he does not know how to sign and despite being in the social services system since he was a child he was in a normal Government school and has never had any specialist support with his hearing loss). Our plan, after lock down, is to find a doctor to assess



his residual hearing and also to enroll him in a school especially for the hearing impaired.

Our second new addition is Jorge and he is about 13. It appears he was staying at another orphanage but they did not like his behaviour so social services sent him to us (not sure exactly why we've been chosen as the home for challenging behaviour children but going to take it as a compliment!). So far he's settling in well. He clearly hasn't been given any boundaries up to this point but is quickly learning our rules and ways. Please pray that he continues to get on well with us.

Sadly, at the very beginning of lockdown in March, Patricia, who had been volunteering with us, decided to go back to Switzerland due to her and her family's concerns about Covid-19. She had originally planned on staying until July and had been considering volunteering longer term but recently we heard that she has accepted a job in Switzerland and will not be returning to kedesh to volunteer in the foreseeable future. This has been a big loss to us, especially at this time of lockdown with all



the boys at home from school. Please pray for God to bring along other willing volunteers and for Patricia as she starts her new job in Switzerland.

To add to the **prayer requests**, my yearly visa expired in May but due to Corona, the Government allowed expired documents to be valid until the 30th September. It's now time to renew it before the deadline and as some of you know, the process can be long and frustrating! Please pray that it goes well this year and that I will remain calm!

Covid cases remain relatively low in our area, please pray that would continue and that we all remain healthy.

There's a plan to reopen the schools gradually starting next month. Please pray this goes well and the boys adapt to studying again.
