

This is Francisco, one of the young men who came through <u>Kedesh Santuario</u> in Mozambique with Heather Pritchard. Francisco is a gifted artist with a deep desire to pursue specialist training to develop his talent further.

Against all odds, he has been accepted into a university in Portugal to study art and refine his gift and talent - a huge opportunity that could change the course of his life. While his first year of tuition and flight are covered, Francisco still needs £650 per month to cover his living expenses during this first crucial year of a four-year degree.

In Mozambique, there is no post-state school grants or funding for higher education, making opportunities like this almost impossible without outside help. We know many of you already give generously, but if you feel moved to support Francisco either with a one-off donation or through ongoing monthly support (short or long term), please speak to Joyce or Fiona C and they'll let you know how to give. Note: If, for any reason, the funding target is not reached, then for donations given through an identifiable method, the donor will have the option for funds to be returned or allocated to the work of Kedesh Santuario. For donations given anonymously, these will be directed to the work of Kedesh Santuario.
